Taking Care of Your Dog's Teeth and Gums



Clean teeth and gums are very important to the overall health of your dog. Here's a brief list of the most common dental problems and ways of preventing them.

3 Common Dental Problems in Dogs



* Periodontitis

The most common dental problem for canines is periodontitis, also known as periodontal disease. The disease is caused by various factors: plaque, food debris, cell mucus, and a mixture of bacteria. This results in a film characterized by milky-white on the dog's teeth as well as the gums. When this film gets combined with saliva, the plaque it causes becomes tartar, and very hard to remove.

* Gingivitis

Gingivitis, also known as gum disease, happens when gum tissue suffers from an inflammation. Without treatment, it can lead to periodontitis, teeth loosening, bone loss, and ultimately, loss of teeth.

* Tooth Fractures

Tooth fractures occur when dogs chew hard substances, such as hard rocks and cow hooves. The fractures result to infection inside the broken tooth, which is known as the endodontic disease.

7 Reasons to Adopt a Senior Dog

According to most veterinarians, a dog falls into the "senior" category around age seven. The size of a dog, however, affects this categorization. Smaller dogs mature slower and become seniors later in life than larger dogs. Animal shelters are filled with healthy and active senior dogs that are in need of a home.

When you're thinking about picking up a dog from your local shelter, don't look past the older dogs. They make great pets for a number of reasons.

1. Senior dogs at shelters need homes just as badly as younger dogs.
2. Adopting an older dog may save its life.
3. Older dogs are not necessarily "problem dogs" as many tend to think.
4. Older dogs usually come trained and understand at least basic commands.
5. You can teach an old dog new tricks.
6. Older dogs are calmer and less energetic than younger dogs.



How to Exercise Your Dog Indoors

Dogs need their daily exercise, and even things like it being too cold or hot outside or the days getting shorter shouldn't get in the way. Here are some tips on how to work out your dog's body and mind indoors:

Run your dog up and down the stairs. Using the stairs is a great way to tire out your dog. The steps add an additional challenge to a dog's workout, as they engage different muscles than those used on a regular walk or run and add an extra level of difficulty with the change in elevation. Stand at the top of the stairs and throw a toy down to your dog. When your dog grabs the toy, call his name and have him bring the toy to you. After several rounds of this, he'll be winded.

Make your dog work for its treats. Take a variety of your dog's favorite treats and hide them around the house – behind doors, under tables, underneath rugs, etc. Your dog will be so busy tracking down his treats that he'll physically tire out in the process. Treat dispensing toys are another great way to keep your dog busy and engage them physically as they push around their toys and try to get to the food inside.

Healthy Pumpkin Balls

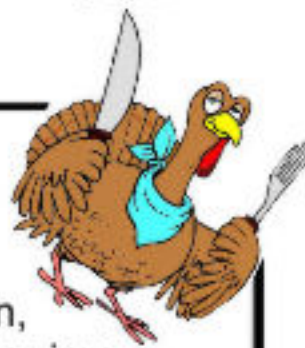
Ingredients

- * ½ cup canned pumpkin
- * 4 tbsp molasses
- * 4 tbsp water
- * 2 tbsp vegetable oil
- * 2 cups whole wheat flour
- * ¼ tsp baking soda
- * ¼ tsp baking powder
- * 1 tsp cinnamon (optional)



Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix pumpkin, molasses, vegetable oil, and water together in a bowl. Add the whole wheat flour, baking soda, baking powder and cinnamon to the mixture and stir until dough softens. Scoop out small spoonfuls of dough and roll into balls on your hands (wet hands work best). Set the balls onto a lightly greased cookie sheet and flatten with a fork. Bake approximately 25 minutes until dough is hardened.
